I would like to say thank you to all of our pupils, parents and staff for their continuous help and support since the children returned to school in August. I know that life outside of school feels a lot more normal however, within educational settings, we are still operating with significant restrictions and daily challenges. Once again, our children have accepted this and adapted beautifully. They are a constant, welcome reminder of resilience, energy and love.

Health and Safety



As mentioned above, we continue to follow the Scottish Government Guidance for Educational Establishments. This means that children continue to remain in their classrooms with limited movement around the school. There will continue to be enhanced cleaning, hand washing and very limited sharing of resources in the classroom. We ask that children do not bring in toys from home, including fidget toys.

Children in each class will continue to play in allocated zones in the playground. We have also been participating in CO2 monitoring, the results of which are sent to South Lanarkshire Council and the Scottish Government.

We are now able to use cloakrooms to help organise the children's belongings. Please ensure that all of your children's clothing is clearly labelled. We have so many new and used garments which we cannot reunite with owners as they are not labelled. Over the coming weeks and months, we will share plans of how we can support families with school uniform and make use of all clothes that are in good condition.

Adults who are dropping their children off are asked to **continue to wear masks at the school gate** and in the school yard (P1 parents only are allowed in the yard).

We have had an increased number of parents presenting at the school office, we respectfully ask that parents do not enter the school building, this is in line with the current Scottish Government Guidance for educational establishments. If you are collecting your child early for any reason, please press the buzzer but remain outside.



As always, children should not leave school during the day unless absolutely essential. Thank you for your continued help to keep our school community safe.

Staffing

I am sure that you will be aware from the media that there are difficulties in maintaining staffing levels in many areas and industries – education is no different and we have already experienced these challenges in Our Lady and St. Anne's. I would like to thank, personally, all of the staff for their continued efforts throughout these times.

Whilst we always try to minimise the impact on the children, there are times where it is necessary to change timetables and move elements of the school day to manage staffing situations, in particular PE times. We understand that this can be hard for parents to keep up with.

To ease this for everyone, we ask that children bring their PE kits into school on a Monday and take them home on a Friday. This means that they will always have access to a PE kit despite any last minute changes.

Within the classroom, all teachers have visual timetables each day to prepare the children for the day ahead and let them know if there are any changes.

I am also sad to say that Miss Milloy is unwell and, despite having hoped to return to work, is unable to do this at the moment. We are all sending Miss Milloy our love and prayers and look forward to seeing her when she is fit and well.

Mrs Ward and Miss Parker will continue to support Rm 6 in the meantime. I would like to say a huge thank you to the boys and girls in Rm 6, they have been superstars and have adapted to these changes perfectly, always modelling our school values of hard work and respect. Well done Room 6!

Attendance and Punctuality

Where possible, outside of these restrictions, please encourage your child to have excellent attendance and punctuality. Children should not be routinely arriving at the school office after 9am – they are missing valuable teaching and learning time.



If your child is unwell, please ensure that you contact the school office and let us know. This means that their absence will be recorded appropriately.

School Uniform

Please ensure your child is wearing full school uniform daily (shirt / tie etc.). We are very proud of our school uniform and how smart our children are.
