OUR CONTEXT

Our Lady and St. Anne's Primary School is a denominational school situated in Hamilton, South Lanarkshire and serves the local catchment areas of Low Waters, Cadzow and Fairhill. The school was rebuilt in 2009 on the site of the original school and has served the community since 1930. The school has 9 classrooms as well as a library, open area and ICT suite. The current school role is 187 children across 7 classes. 53% of our pupils live in SMID 1 and 2 with 37% of children entitled to Free School Meals. Our Lady and St. Anne's is part of the Holy Cross Cluster. We work in partnership with all agencies and extended teams within the Learning Community to meet the needs of our pupils and provide high quality educational experiences for our young people.



As a Catholic school, we endeavour to place Christ and Our Lady at the centre of everything we do. We are committed to working in partnership with pupils, parents, partners, the parish and the wider community to ensure we provide the highest quality of education across all curricular areas, with the needs of the whole child – spiritual, emotional, social, physical and academic – being recognised, nurtured and developed.

OUR ETHOS

The strong Catholic ethos within Our Lady and St Anne's Primary School is supported by a strong partnership with our parish community and parish Priest. Our school values are rooted in Gospel values and reflect the high aspirations we have for our whole school community. We focus on successes, celebrating achievement and endeavour, and prove a safe, nurturing, respectful and inclusive environment where everyone is valued and supported to thrive.

We understand that our children's outcomes are closely linked to their health and wellbeing and a recognised strength of Our Lady and St. Anne's is the nurturing ethos that permeates our school. We consistently strive to get it right for every child and support our families, who we value as the first educators of our children. In line with Article 29 of the United Nations Convention for the Rights of the Child, we encourage our children to develop their personalities and abilities as much as possible and to respect other people's rights and the environment.

CURRICULUM RATIONALE

The unique context of Our Lady and St. Anne's Primary School is reflected in both the design and the content of our curriculum. As part of our wider consultation, staff defined **curriculum**:



PRINCIPLES OF CURRICULUM DESIGN

The **Seven Design Principles** underpin the OLSA Primary School curriculum:

PROGRESSION: The school's progression pathways help ensure that learning experiences continually build on pupils' existing knowledge, skills and achievements. The approach allows all pupils to progress at a rate which meets their needs and aptitudes.

CHALLENGE AND ENJOYMENT: Staff plan challenging and engaging learning experiences which encourage high aspirations and ambitions for all of our pupils. Learners of all aptitudes and abilities experience an appropriate level of challenge, enabling each child to achieve their full potential.

BREADTH: Pupils have the opportunity to benefit from a broad range of experiences, enabling them to learn and develop within their classroom and through other aspects of school life. Out of school visits and guest speakers are arranged throughout the year to enhance and reinforce the children's learning.

DEPTH: As they progress through the school, pupils develop and apply increasing intellectual rigour, drawing different strands of learning together and exploring and achieving more advanced levels of understanding.

PERSONALISATION AND CHOICE: Pupil voice is developed through 'The Wee Blether' and 'The Big Blether.' House Leaders, the Pupil Council and Leadership Groups provide pupils with opportunities to develop aptitudes and talents beyond the classroom. These experiences also give pupils opportunities to exercise responsible personal choice as they move through the school.

COHERENCE: The totality of pupils' learning activities combine to form a coherent experience. Staff ensure there are clear links between the different aspects of pupils' learning, including opportunities for activities which draw different strands of learning together.

RELEVANCE: Pupils being clear about the purpose of their learning activities is fundamental to our approach. Pupils are helped to see the value of what they are learning and its relevance to their lives, both now and in the future.

THE FOUR CAPACITIES

Our curriculum aims to ensure that each and every OLSA pupil develops the knowledge, skills and attributes they will need to flourish in life, learning and work, now and in the future. The purpose of our curriculum is encapsulated in the **Four Capacities** to enable each child to be a:

THE FOUR CONTEXTS FOR LEARNING

OLSA Primary School pupils learn through all their experiences – in their families, within their community, at school – and our curriculum continually seeks to recognise, celebrate and complement the contribution these varied experiences make to our children's learning and development. Our curriculum, therefore, includes all of the experiences which are planned for pupils through their education. These experiences are grouped into **Four Contexts for Learning:**

ETHOS AND LIFE OF THE SCHOOL: The starting point for learning in OLSA's is a nurturing ethos and a climate of respect and trust based on our shared values of Respect, Inclusion, Hard Work, Fairness and Faith.

CURRICULUM AREAS AND SUBJECTS: The curriculum areas are the organisers for setting out the 'Experiences and Outcomes' which OLSA Primary School teaching staff use to plan learning and teaching. Each curricular area contributes to the Four Capacities.

INTERDISCIPLINARY LEARNING: Our curriculum includes space for regular learning across and beyond subject boundaries, where considered planning by teachers makes authentic and meaningful links across the curriculum.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR PERSONAL ACHIEVEMENT: OLSA pupils have regular opportunities for achievements both in the classroom and beyond, giving them a sense of satisfaction and pride and building motivation, confidence and resilience.

AREAS GIVEN PARTICULAR EMPHASIS IN OUR CONTEXT

Our Lady and St. Anne's Primary places particular emphasis on the acquisition of literacy and numeracy skills. We want all pupils to achieve the highest possible levels of literacy and numeracy. We believe these skills support children throughout their lives and provide a sound basis for pupils to develop as lifelong learners.





