| Correspondence | Thanks was given to the elected members for the grant of £4500 which we plan to use to improve our sound system in the hall. Comminication was received over the Summer regarding PVGs. Mrs McLean stated the the Holy Cross Learning Community were looking at this and what the requirements would mean. |
| Local Representatives | Cllr Keatt spoke about the recent challenges facing SLC Transport/Roadworks/ Housing. He also stated that he had recently met with Lyndsay McRoberts, the newly appointed Executive Director of Education for SLC. Guidance will be provided on the use of mobile phones in schools. Breakfast Club funding is to be expanded and resources for Breakfast Clubs are being rolled out. Mrs McLean asked about our school roll, stating that we only have 12 new P1s while other schools around us are full at some stages. The Councillors said that this was due to new housing in other areas and at the moment there were no plans regarding boundary changes. Birth rates would be monitored for the coming years.
